

## INVOCATION OF THE APPOINTEMENT OF THE NESHER, SHREDDER OF DEMONS

LESSON FROM THE LAB - "NESHER" IS NOT "EAGLE" (in this case)

For much of my experience as a Christian I occasionally heard either a Bible class teacher or preacher teach on this passage:

*"Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name! Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy, who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the [נִשְׁרָר neshers] eagle's. The LORD works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed." Psalm 103:1-6 ESV*

Or this passage:

*"Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength. Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like [נִשְׁרָר neshers]; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint." Isaiah 40:28-31 ESV*

They would carry on by explaining that in the eagle's life cycle this majestic bird would regenerate after molting its feathers, pulling out its talons and knocking its beak off on a rock. Unquestioningly I believed this and tried to declare that my youth was renewed like the eagle by invoking these passages and the Scripture that tells us all promises of the Lord are "Yes" to those that believe in Him:

*"For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, whom we proclaimed among you, Silvanus and Timothy and I, was not Yes and No, but in him it is always Yes. For all the promises of God find their Yes in him. That is why it is through him that we utter our Amen to God for his glory. And it is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has anointed us, and who has also put his seal on us and given us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee." II Corinthians 1:19-21 ESV*

Usually, I can feel a shift or release of power in the spirit when I declare a promise of God, but not this time. Puzzled, I researched the claim that eagles regenerate and found the claim to be false! Since I know that the Scriptures and true science are in accord, I looked deeper into the word translated "eagle" and found the original word in Hebrew is "נִשְׁרָר" pronounced "nesher". It can be translated as eagle, but more generally means any large bird of prey and literally means "one who lacerates or shreds".

Therefore, I did a cursory search and did not find any birds of prey that did more regarding regeneration than merely molt their feathers. At a loss how to declare this promise in English, I simply used the original word "nesher" and declared my youth is renewed like one of those "shredders". Immediately I felt a surge of power in the Spirit as confirmation that I had it correct this time! In the spirit I saw that great, hard, strong, razor-sharp talons had been added to my spiritual armory too. In the spirit I also saw that the demons who had previously be bold to try and come near to harass me were absolutely terrified and keeping far away at a safe distance. Whenever one had the temerity to try to sneak up on me, I would make raking motion with my hands where it was, and the demon was immediately shredded.

Here is the invocation used to manifest this:

**The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. The Lord does not faint or grow weary. His understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength. My soul and all that is within me blesses the LORD. I bless His holy Name, and I remember and rejoice in all his benefits! For the Lord forgives me of every iniquity and heals me of all diseases. The Lord redeems my life from the pit. He crowns me with steadfast love and mercy. He satisfies me with good so that my youth is renewed like the [ נֶשֶׁר ] neshet, the shredder of demons. Though youths may faint and become weary, though young men may fall exhausted, because I wait for the LORD my strength is renewed, like a [ נֶשֶׁר ] neshet, the shredder of demons. Because the Lord cannot lie and He keeps His promises, I mount up with wings and I run without wearying, like a [ נֶשֶׁר ] neshet, the shredder of demons. Because the Word of the Lord does not fail, I walk and do not faint, like a [ נֶשֶׁר ] neshet, the shredder of demons. For the LORD works righteousness and justice for me against every oppression and every oppressor. I am a [ נֶשֶׁר ] neshet, the shredder of demons Amen!**
